

**2001 GOVERNOR'S SCHOOLS AND FOREIGN LANGUAGE ACADEMIES
SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT DATES AND INFORMATION**

Early November School selects arts applicants to participate in state adjudication process and submits completed application for each applicant to the school division's gifted program administrator.

November 17, 2000 Deadline for mailing the applicants report for site adjudication form and two labels for the gifted education coordinator for the division or private school coordinator for the region to Daniel Hocutt, director of the adjudication process.

December 13, 2000 Individual student adjudication schedules will be mailed to gifted program administrators to be given to the students.

December 15, 2000 Deadline for gifted program administrators to notify Daniel Hocutt of needed percussion instruments (for instrumental music applicants) and other special needs of applicants.

January 5, 2001 Names of Governor's Foreign Language Academy nominees forwarded to the local gifted coordinator or other designated person for certification of funding.

January 6, 2001 Site I Adjudication, University of Richmond

January 12, 2001 Deadline for mailing Governor's Foreign Language Academy applications to the Department of Education. Only applications for which funding has been certified should be submitted. Deadline for local gifted coordinator or other designated person to mail the Foreign Language Nominee Report Form to the Department of Education.

January 13, 2001 Site II Adjudication, Emory and Henry College

January 20, 2001 Site III Adjudication and Snow Make-Up Date, Lynchburg College

January 26, 2001 Completed adjudication forms (two for each student) mailed to all gifted program administrators.

Early February Date to be determined by gifted program administrator as deadline for schools to submit completed applications (with adjudication forms attached) to the gifted program administrator or the division selection committee.

February 13, 2001 Deadline for mailing Summer Residential Governor's School applications and the division nomination reports to the Department of Education. Only applications for which funding has been certified should be submitted.

First week of April 2001 Notification of status will be mailed directly to Mentorship Nominees.

Mid-April, 2001 Deadline for mailing letters of acceptance or alternate status to the nominees from the Department of Education.
