- 1) All schools shown are accredited with warning in either English or math based on student performance on the spring 2000 Standards of Learning (SOL) assessments.
 - 2) The base funding for this program provides 150 hours of instruction for each school that is accredited with warning in either English or math.
 - 3) Schools shown will also receive additional funding per student based on the number of students in each school that is expected to take the SOL assessments in the spring of 2001.
 - 4) Primary schools where second grade is the highest grade that are accredited with warning in English or math because they are paired with a tested school are not eligible for funding under this initiative.
 - 5) The number of students shown for each school is based on 2000 Fall Membership in grades 3, 5, 8, 11, and half of each school's ungraded students.
 - 6) The state will pay 100 percent of this initiative.
