

**2002 GOVERNOR'S SCHOOLS AND FOREIGN LANGUAGE ACADEMIES
SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT DATES AND INFORMATION**

- Early November** School selects arts applicants to participate in state adjudication process and submits completed application for each applicant to the school division's gifted program administrator.
- November 16, 2001** Deadline for mailing the Applicants Report for Site Adjudication form and two name and address labels for the gifted education coordinator or private school coordinator to Sheryl Johnson, director of the adjudication process; address may be found on the form in the appropriate guides.
- December 10, 2001** Individual student adjudication schedules will be mailed to gifted education coordinators to be given to the students.
- December 14, 2001** Deadline for gifted education coordinators to notify Sheryl Johnson of needed percussion instruments (for instrumental music applicants) and other special needs of applicants.
- January 5, 2002** Site I Adjudication, University of Richmond
- January 7, 2002** Names of Governor's Foreign Language Academy nominees forwarded to the local gifted education coordinator or other designated person for certification of funding.
- January 12, 2002** Site II Adjudication, Emory and Henry College
- January 15, 2002** Deadline for mailing Governor's Foreign Language Academy applications to the Department of Education. Only applications for which funding has been certified should be submitted. Deadline for local gifted education coordinator or other designated person to mail the Foreign Language Nominee Report Form to the Department of Education.
- January 19, 2002** Site III Adjudication, Lynchburg College
- January 25, 2002** Completed adjudication forms (two for each student) mailed to all gifted education coordinators.
- Early February** Date to be determined by gifted education coordinator as deadline for schools to submit completed applications (with adjudication forms attached) to the gifted education coordinator or the division selection committee.
- February 13, 2002** Deadline for mailing Summer Residential Governor's School applications and the division nomination reports to the Department of Education. Only applications for which funding has been certified should be submitted.
- First week of April 2002** Notification of students selected for mentorship will be made by phone or fax.
- Mid-April, 2002** Notification to nominees for remaining summer residential programs will be made by the Department of Education through letters of acceptance or alternate status.
