Anticipated impact, specific intended outcomes	15	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ This should flow directly from the rationale (Section B). ▪ Expected changes in student performance, behavior, skills, attitudes are stated. ▪ If other target audiences, or systems-targeted initiative, other types of changes are stated. ▪ Can they articulate what they are trying to accomplish? What will be different if the initiative is a success? ▪ Is the project “do-able”? Are there clear, obtainable impacts? <i>(The more items addressed, the more points awarded)</i> 	<div style="text-align: right;">Points <input style="width: 40px; height: 20px;" type="text"/></div>

Three specific strengths	10	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Three different strengths regarding the LTTA are identified. ▪ Strengths are thought-out and described, not just listed. <i>(Full points are not given if this repeats info in section G)</i> 	<div style="text-align: right;">Points <input style="width: 40px; height: 20px;" type="text"/></div>

Barriers	10	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Evidence that they understand what barriers might exist. ▪ Evidence that they have thought through possible problems and what the impact might be. <i>(Fewer points are awarded if no explanations are given)</i> 	<div style="text-align: right;">Points <input style="width: 40px; height: 20px;" type="text"/></div>
G. Additional resources available	10	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ May include people, money, time, expertise within school, agency, community; should be described not just listed. ▪ Evidence that they are willing to contribute something to make the initiative a success. <i>(More points are awarded for willingness to develop resources)</i> 	<div style="text-align: right;">Points <input style="width: 40px; height: 20px;" type="text"/></div>
