¹ The original fiscal year 2011 amount allocated to K-12 by the 2010 General Assembly was \$126,372,427. However, based on the state's final Phase II application, incorporating all actions of Chapter 874, 2010 Acts of Assembly, the fiscal year 2011 portion allocated to K-12 has been reduced to \$122,941,314.

² The fiscal year 2011 SFSF allocations will be available for use by school divisions through the SFSF obligation deadline of September 30, 2011. Please note, final approval of the revised Phase II application by the U.S. Department of Education (USED) is pending and could be amended based on final guidance from USED. However, it is not anticipated that changes will occur in the allocations shown in this attachment.
