The annual **HEALTH FOR SUCCESS CONFERENCE**, scheduled for July 8-11, 2012, at Longwood University, is planned for anyone interested in improving the school health and well-being of today's youth. The conference is appropriate for teachers, instructional specialists, administrators, school nurses, health assistants, supervisors of health services, counselors, social workers, parents, and any others whose responsibility is to educate today's youth on Family Life Education issues.

**Certificates of Attendance and (M)CHES**

**Certification:** Participants will receive a Certificate of Attendance for teacher re-certification through their school divisions. Those interested may apply for Master (MCHES) and Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES) recertification credits. Both re-certifications require all applicable sessions to be attended in full for credit.

**Conference Registration: All participants must be pre-registered.** There will be no on-site registration. The **registration fee of \$100.00** includes conference materials, air-conditioned dormitory housing, **double** occupancy with

shared bath for three (3) nights, three (3) meals per day on Monday and Tuesday, and breakfast and lunch on Wednesday. Single rooms are available for the disabled only. Please call Caroline Fuller at 804-225-2431, if you are in need of a single room.

Payment and registration must be received by **June 1, 2012**. A **late fee** of an additional **\$25.00** will be charged for registrations received after June 1, 2012. Participants who commute or stay off-campus will receive lunch only on the days of attendance. The \$100.00 registration fee applies to partial attendance or off-campus registration. Checks should be made payable to the **Treasurer of Virginia**. Purchase orders and credit card payments will not be accepted.

A three graduate credit hour class will be offered through Longwood University based upon participant interest. The course will be offered Sunday-Tuesday evenings at a cost of \$939 for in-state residents and \$2,415 for out-of-state residents. This class can be taken as a Pass-Fail or graded graduate class.

Workshops are limited to approximately 30 participants on a first-come, first-serve basis. For a workshop to be offered there must be at least ten registered participants. If you are a first-time Family Life Education participant, it is recommended that you attend the *Understanding Human Sexuality Today* workshop. Spaces are limited, so please respond as soon as possible.
