Students who study one language for an extended period of time will have the opportunity to achieve the highest levels of performance in the five goal areas: Communication, Cultures, Connections, Comparisons, and Communities.

Students pursuing an advanced diploma must successfully complete three years of one language or two years of two languages.

Students may begin the study of a new language, i.e., French I or Latin I (Grades 6-12), German I, Japanese I (Grades 7-12) or Russian (Grades 9-12)

GOAL 1 – COMMUNICATION

Communicate in Spanish *

Standards

Interpersonal Mode (IP)

SIV.1.IP: Communication: Interpersonal

- Exchange information in Spanish with the purpose of persuading others.
- Exchange information in Spanish that focuses on abstract ideas.
- Interact with others in Spanish to express content in the present, past and future.
- Exchange level-appropriate information in Spanish using available technology.

SIV.1.IR: Communication: Interpretive

- Recognize in Spanish mood and implied meaning of oral and written communication, such as humor, sarcasm, and intent.
- Derive meaning in Spanish from new information in a variety of literary texts.
- Interpret meaning in Spanish from culturally authentic materials and sources, such as television, radio, newspaper, magazines, and Internet.
- Analyze in Spanish the main ideas and significant details in literary works and other authentic materials.

SIV.1.P: Communication: Presentational

- Present unrehearsed information in Spanish about occurrences in the present, past, and future.
- Present level-appropriate information in Spanish using available technology.

GOAL 2 – CULTURES

Gain Knowledge and Understanding of the Cultures of the Spanish-Speaking World *

Standards

2.1 Students demonstrate an understanding of the relationship among products, practices, and perspectives of the cultures studied.

2.2 Students demonstrate an awareness, acceptance, and appreciation of diverse cultures.

SIV.2.IP: Cultures: Interpersonal

- Interact with others in Spanish to identify new products that have become part of Spanish-speaking cultures.
- Exchange information in Spanish on the impact of new products on the established practices and perspectives in Spanish-speaking cultures.

SIV.2.IR: Cultures: Interpretive

- Identify new products that have become part of Spanish-speaking cultures using a variety of sources.
- Identify established practices and perspectives in Spanish-speaking cultures.

SIV.2.P: Cultures: Presentational

- Predict in Spanish the impact of new products on the practices and perspectives of Spanish-speaking cultures.
- Present information in Spanish on the advantages and disadvantages of new products replacing traditional products of Spanish-speaking cultures.

GOAL 3 – CONNECTIONS

Use Spanish to Connect with Other Disciplines and Expand Knowledge *

Standards

- 3.1 Students reinforce and expand their knowledge of other disciplines through the study of Spanish.
- 3.2 Students acquire information and recognize the distinctive viewpoints that are only available through the study of Spanish and its cultures.

SIV.3.IP: Connections: Interpersonal

- Ask and answer questions in Spanish to predict changes that may occur in other subject areas in the future.

SIV.3.IR: Connections: Interpretive

- Identify new information in Spanish that may indicate impending changes in other subject areas.

- Present unrehearsed information in Spanish that includes predictions about changes that may occur in other subject areas

GOAL 4 – COMPARISONS

Develop Insight through Spanish into the Nature of Language and Culture *

Standards

- 4.1 Students demonstrate understanding of the nature of language through comparisons of Spanish and their own language.
- 4.2 Students demonstrate understanding of the concept of culture through comparisons of the Spanish-speaking cultures studied and their own culture.

SIV.4.IP: Comparisons: Interpersonal

- Ask and answer questions in Spanish to obtain information on how they and their peers in Spanish-speaking cultures view the same topics.

SIV.4.IR: Comparisons: Interpretive

- Identify in Spanish common topics of interest for them and their peers in Spanish-speaking cultures.

SIV.4.P: Comparisons: Presentational

- Compare in Spanish how they and their peers in Spanish-speaking cultures view the same topics

GOAL 5 – COMMUNITIES

Use Spanish to Participate in Multilingual Communities at Home and Around the World *

Standards

- 5.1 Students use Spanish for meaningful purposes both within and beyond the school setting.
- 5.2 Students explore opportunities to use Spanish for personal growth and career goals at home and abroad.

- Ask and answer questions in Spanish to gain information about current and future career opportunities in global communities.

SIV.5.IR: Communities: Interpretive

- Identify resources that offer information in Spanish about current and future career opportunities in which knowledge of Spanish would be beneficial.

SIV.5.P: Communities: Presentational

- Summarize in Spanish how one's ability to communicate in Spanish will increase career opportunities.
